





## MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL




### NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFIED TEACHER



### Congratulations to Mr. Eric Chapman from Film and TV

To qualify for National Board for Professional Teaching Standards certification, one must be a licensed teacher with a bachelor's degree and at least three years of professional experience. Having met those prerequisites, a teacher may apply for certification in one of 25 specializations.

The Exceptional Student Services department or ESS, works with students in a wide range of educational capacities, like for example with accommodations and specially designed instruction. The ESS team is responsible for collaborating with parents/quardians, teachers, and students to ensure students receive the required services and supports they need to be successful both socially and academically. Our efforts encourage and aid students during their four-year educational journey here at Youngker High School, with a goal of helping students prepare for a transition to their career/life aspirations after high school. The ESS team designs and delivers specially design instruction (SDI) to assistance students in the classroom and to make

learning individualized to their needs. The ESS department also helps teachers and students in the regular education settings as well with paraprofessional support, testing referrals, eligibility requirements and recommendations for both accommodations and modifications.

#### Did you know:

When a student has an Individualized Education Program (IEP) or a 504 plan, you'll likely hear the words like, accommodation and modification. While the two words sound similar, they mean different things.

·An accommodation changes **how** a student learns the material.

·A modification changes **what** a student is taught or expected to learn.

Last week's assembly, a canned food drive, the football team's overwhelming victory against the rival school, your friends, your teachers, and your campus. A concept that generations of students before us never had. Film and TV Production is a program that was introduced to Youngker in the fall semester of 2021. The class has become a safe space and outlet for student creativity. The course teaches skills like editing with Adobe, camera skills, and exploring the creative process. Many students have found Film and TV to be the starting point for their future career in Film or TV Production and have expressed how the program has completely changed the atmosphere at Youngker High School.

Creative freedom is a concept that many students aren't familiar in the current educational climate. This is what makes the Film and TV program stand out. Not many classes have students learn how to compose a live production, or create a commercial with a group of other students. From creating a storyboard to editing the final video, students are in complete creative control over their projects. We asked "What makes the Film and TV program stand out from other programs on campus?" Jason Perez, president of the Youngker Film and TV Club, said; "It's probably the most hands- on class here at youngker. I've had the opportunity to be on all sides of the production process,



editing, directing, camera work, even being in front of the camera." Students who are passionate about expressing themselves creatively thrive in this program, making it a gateway to a future career in the industry.

Many students are interested in pursuing a career in film and television production. The program provides many resources to prepare these individuals for what they want to work towards. When asked if they were considering if they wanted to go into a career with Film and TV, Brody Mascerenas, Vice President of the Youngker Film and TV Club, said "Yes, I want to be a filmmaker so I can express myself.". In the class students are presented with the opportunity to learn how to use Adobe After Effects and Premiere Pro, two industry standard programs, to help with their video projects at no cost to them. Projects that students will work on offer them a chance to experience what workers in the film industry do.

One of the most outstanding things about the Film and TV Program here at Youngker is the impact that it has made on students that are a part of the class and the club. Youngker FTV has a very social climate, meaning you get the opportunity to collaborate and interact with like minded and creative people. For a lot of

students, this means breaking out of your comfort zone. Hannah Rouse said,"Most of my high school career, I considered myself a very introverted person but after my experience in the Film and TV program, I began talking to more people, forming new relationships." This is an important aspect to developing the professional career of students, not only in the Film and TV industry, but almost every industry in the world. The relationships formed and strengthened in the Youngker FTV program is something that everybody holds dear to their heart.

Film and TV Production has changed Youngker for the better. Giving us a new way to get word out and hear what is happening on campus, allowing students to be more involved with technology, and offering a new skill many students didn't even consider. Students moving on from this course will leave with knowledge to help their careers and hobbies. It also will always be a safe space for many students who want to do more through the club. Film and TV at Youngker will always be an expressive area for those with creative passion.
